Course title

Calvino in three books

Topics and course structure

A critical approach to literary communication. In particular, the program deals with the main features of literariness and of narrative; the monographic section will focus on one or more patterns of narratives.

The monographic section of this lecture course will focus on Italo Calvino, whose centenary is being celebrated in 2023. The three works included in the programme are representative of different periods of his literary activity: an extensive narration which revisits and rielaborates the patterns of both historical novel and Bildungsroman through the fantastic filter, in a close dialogue with present events (*The Baron in the Trees*, 1957); a book hard to define, which resumes the shape of the collection of stories with a frame narrative, aimed at discussing the future of human society, in a kaleidoscopic series of imaginary places (*The Invisible Cities*, 1972); a hyper-novel composed by ten beginnings of novel, which is altogether a catalogue of reading modes and a tribute to the readers.

Objectives

The main goal is to assure that the students become familiar with the close reading of texts, that includes the ability to understand semantic values, ambiguities, implicit assumptions, and therefore to appreciate both communicative principles and cultural significance. At the same time the teaching programme aims to develop and corroborate reading skills and textual comprehension skills, and expressive proficiency.

Methodologies

Lectures and discussion. Text analysis: linguistic and rhetorical features, narrative modes, cultural patterns. Summarizing exercises.
