Course title

Foundations of Chinese Culture

Topics and course structure

The course will be divided in two parts, the first on Contemporary China and new media and the second on ancient and modern China (Conception and writing of history, intellectuals and power; Philosophy and religion; Ancient and Modern Novel; End of the Empire and the beginning of Modernity; Maoism and post-Maoism), with a special focus on the constant re-actualization of ancient and modern culture in contemporary China.

Objectives

To acquire a basic knowledge of the main development lines of thought, politics and literature in China, to be able to have a critical reading of how Contemporary China is narrated today.
