#### Course title

Theoretical Approaches in Social Anthropology

#### **Topics and course structure**

Main theoretical issues, authors and schools in the history of social/cultural anthropology will be presented in this course. Special attention will be given to the emergence of modernity in non-western societies and the effects this has had on social/cultural anthropology.

### **Objectives**

Students will enhance their curiosity about the world, love of learning and a sense of wonder for cultural diversity. Through class debates they will also improve their communication skills. Aim of the course is a better grasping of the role of social and cultural diversities in the contemporary world, as well as a critical assessment of the constructed character of social norms and conventions. Further goal of the course is the awareness of the paradoxes and the epistemological problems inherent anthropological knowledge and field research.

### Methodologies

Lectures, films, ethnographic documentaries, class debates on specific topics emerging from assigned reading materials, talks given by experts in specific fields.
