Learning objectives

The course aims to study the legal aspects of international organizations and institutions, allowing students to acquire a deeper understanding of international institutional law and of the issues concerning the legal nature of international organizations, their functioning and activities.

Contents

The course will consider the following topics: The legal nature of international organizations and of international institutional law. The typology of international organizations: in particular universal (United Nations, UN Specialized Agencies) and regional (African Union, Organization of American States) organizations. The legal personality of international organizations. The founding treaties of international organizations. The organs of international organizations, their structure and functioning. The functions and powers of international organizations. The internal legal orders of international organizations. The immunities of international organizations and their personnel. The responsibility of international organizations. The domestic implementation of the acts of international organizations.

Detailed program

Prerequisites

Students are preliminarily required to know the foundations of international law, concerning in particular the international legal personality, the sources of international law (custom, treaties, general principles of law), the law of international responsibility, the settlement of international disputes.

Teaching methods

The subject-matter of the course will be considered and critically analysed following a seminarial method, based on the discussion of relevant sources and documents, which will be circulated in classroom and available on the elearning website of the course.
