Contents

The course in Advanced Labour Law aims to go into some central and topical issues concerning the Regulation of Working Contractual Relations.

Detailed program

The course in Advanced Labour Law aims to go into some central and topical issues concerning the Regulation of Working Contractual Relations. Bringing into focus single issues allows to verify either techniques of regulation working within it or relations between different sources of law: namely European Regulation, Constitutional Principles, Employment Regulation, Collective Bargaining, Individual Contract. For the students who attend the class the topics will be examined through the case-law method. For non-attending students, the study will be based on monographic essays.

Prerequisites

Mandatory to have passed the courses of Istituzioni di Diritto Privato, Diritto Costituzionale and Diritto del lavoro.

Teaching methods

Case-law approach.

"Socratic methodology".

Interactive analysis and discussion of the legal issues.

Assessment methods

Students who attend the course will take the examination through procedures to be defined during the course, comprehensive of the possibility of written examinations, working papers and a final oral examination.

Students who do not attend the course will take an oral examination.

Textbooks and Reading Materials

Program for the students who attend the class will be provided during the course.

Not Attending students.

Students are required to know those general parts of the Labour Law handbook (the text used for the basic class in Labour Law) on the discipline relevant for the exam. Book adopted: L. Fiorillo, A. Since the law was recently modified, students are required to contact the professor by e-mail to receive proper instructions about legislation and extra papers.
