Learning objectives

The class will be structured in three main educational objectives:

1. Knowledge and comprehension of the organisational functioning of the social service, considering the relationships with the institution, with the territorial context and the services system.
2. Knowledge of the role, functions, and work of the Social Worker inside the system of offering and as concern the institutional and professional mandate.
3. Self-knowledge and gradual improvement of a professional identity, through the experience of an internship in a service and the possibility to discuss the experience during the lessons.

Contents

- 1 Reading and comprehension of the organisational functioning of the internship institution
- 2 Analysis of the territorial contest and its influence in the life trajectory
- 3 Comprehension of the Social Worker role in the organisations
- 4 Sharing the revision of the experience
- 5 Incentive of the reflectivity and the critical reading of phenomenon.

Detailed program

The class aims to provide elements for reading and understanding the complexity of organisations, institutions and services, referring in particular to the analysis of the institutions of the internship and its interrelations with different operative contexts. The class will provide a new reading of territorial context to identify the elements of problematicness and community resources, as further analysis of the territory studied during the 1st year.

Furthermore, it highlights the comprehension of the job of Social Worker and provides instruments to analyse and understand the working methods, referring in particular to the interview, the domestic visit, the network, the documents, the writing and the work with the community, as regards the code of ethics.

During the class, the way to the professional growth of the student will be stimulated for the approach to the profession, encouraging the reflection and re-elaboration process of the emotional experience demanded of the internship both with an internship agenda, both promoting the discussion in the group. Furthermore, the class provides a new multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary vision promoting the connection between practical experience of the internship and the theoretical elements learned during the university classes.

Prerequisites

Basic knowledge of Fundamentals of Social service and the system of offering in the social services, coming from the internship experience of the 1st year.

Teaching methods

The learning method contemplates theoretical contributions, in-class exercises and a direct activation of the students that are demanded to introduce their own productions starting from the observations made during the internship.

Assessment methods

The student has to write a final report that will be discussed during a meeting with the professor of Internship Guide and with the supervisor of the internship. The overall final assessment of the student will consider the work done in the class, the evaluation by the internship supervisor, the final report, and the transversal elements to social work (interest and motivation, critical and revision skills).
