Aims

HISTORY OF MEDICINE - The aim of course is to introduce the student to know the historical and epistemological pathway that led to the

birth and the development of medicine in Italy and in the world.

NURSING AND HUMAN SCIENCES - Bring students to a critical approach concerning accountability and autonomy in professional practice addressing: nurse's accountability and professional regulations; l'interprofessionalità, support workers and the risk management. Nursing education in Italy. National and regional laws for the Continuing Medical Education (CME).

PROFESSIONAL ETHICS -Deepen principles, concepts and professional values guide nursing action: insights into the Italian Deontological

Code of Nursing Professions (2019). Know a method for the analysis of ethical and professional behavior in clinical situations and value conflicts. Approaching topics related to equity of care and rationality of services, ethical dilemmas of end of life research, clinical trials and topics dealt with in the classroom related to bioethics with an indepth study of the problems that arise in the context of care.

Contents

The integrated course as a whole aims to acquaint the student with the historical and epistemological and normative path that led to the birth and development of nursing in Italy and around the world.

The students will also be able to critically analyze the ethical and deontological aspects present in the professional context; deepen their knowledge of the national code of ethics and some internationally recognized nursing codes, in particular the ICN 2021 in order to better develop ethical choices as a moral agent capable of making decisions in the face of ethical dilemmas through the use of Fry and Johnstone's decision-making model (e.g. ethical dilemmas, value conflicts, and care problems encountered in professional practice); deepen professional principles, concepts, and values; learn about and discuss related topics with bioethics such as ethical end-of-life issues, aspects related to objection and conscience clause, research and clinical and care experimentation, equity of care and rationality of services; resource allocation. Aspects related to deontological responsibility. Ethical/deontological

considerations during a pandemic.

Together, these knowledge contributions will form the basis for the reading of the current health care reality and will encourage, through in-depth study of regulatory assumptions and professional issues, the development of critical reflection for research and professional practice, helping to consolidate responsibility and autonomy in the future professional.

Detailed program

HISTORY OF MEDICINE - Evolutionary Medicine and the origin of diseases. the birth of rational medicine in the classical era (teurgic medicine, Hippocrates, medicine in the Hellenistic period, Roman medicine, Galen, Byzantine Medicine); Medieval medicine and risk of charity (Medicine and Christianity, Monastic Medicine, Islamic Medicine. Medical School of Salerno, Hospitals and Universities; Black Death); Renaissance (Health reforms in Early Modern Age; the discovery of human body, Vesalius and the anatomy, the development of surgery): Baroque Medicine (Galileo and Medicine, William Harvey and the discovery of blood circulation, Malpighi and the microscopy, iatrophysics, iatrochemistry and neo-hippocraticism); Eighteenth-century medicine (Social Medicine, Medicine and Revolution, Medical Systems, Morgagni and the pathological anatomy, Mesmerism, Phrenology and Homeopathy, Jenner and vaccination); Nineteenth-century Medicine (the birth of clinics, Florence Nightingale and the modern nursing, Biochemistry, Physiology and Pathology, Anesthetic gases, antisepsis, a new Surgery, Germ Theory, Germ Hunters, the birth of radiology). Medicine in the twentieth century (Antimicrobial therapies, serotherapy chemotherapy, antibiotic therapy, medicine between the two World Wars, eugenics, Nazi experiments and Nuremberg, the birth of the British NHS, Medicine in the years of the economic boom, the Italian NHS and health reforms, new challenges of medicine).

NURSING AND HUMAN SCIENCES - Learn about regulatory and professional antecedents; learn about criminal, civil and disciplinary responsibility; identify nurse accountability in management and use of social media; analyze accountability in nursing practice and

the role of support workers and the inter-professional dimension; know and identify nurse accountability in clinical risk management and in Continuing Medical Education (CME / CPD Continuing Medical Education and Continuing Professional Development System).

PROFESSIONAL ETHICS -Recalls on the main ethical theories, in-depth analysis and exercises on welfare cases proposed by students on

principles, concepts and professional values. Aspects of ethical responsibility Knowledge and reflections on the Deontological Code of Nursing Professions (2019) and the Canadian and ICN 2021 codes. Learning a method for the ethical-deontological analysis of clinical situations that present problems and conflicts of values. End of life ethical issues (Death and dying - Palliative care - Pain, dignity in the care of the elderly). Equity of care and rationality of services. Clinical and welfare research and experimentation, transgender and gender diversity: related ethical aspects. Ethics committees: function, composition and usefulness in nursing practice and research

Defined by the educational regulations.

Teaching form

Lecture, discussion, brainstorming, clinical training, meetings with experts, individual study, analysis of clinical cases, viewing thematic films. The teaching language is Italian.

Assessment method

There are no ongoing tests. Final exam aims to assess the extensive check on the preparation of the exam program and intensive check on the skills of self-reflection on critical points of the program. Attainment of the proficiency level is mandatory for all three teaching modules for passing the exam. The final grade is the result of the average of the three modules that are part of the teaching. The test in written form, by means of single-and/or multiple-choice quizzes (10) and open-ended questions with short answers (3) for the History of Medicine module, after passing which one is eligible for the oral test, which involves competent discussion of cases with ethical deontological or professional responsibility implications, for the Professional Deontology and Nursing Human Sciences modules.
