Aims

Students will be able to recognize:

- the Italian Legislation and Policy about organ and tissue donation and transplantation;
- the nurses' role in donation and transplantation process;
- the nursing care to patients undergoing transplantation.

Contents

The demand for organ transplants has increased over the years but this does not correspond to an adequate number of donations. The possibility of increasing the number of organs available for transplantation depends both on the improvement of alternative methods to transplantation from a cadaveric donor and, and above all, on the attitude of the population and the preparation of health personnel towards transplantation and organ donation. The nurse plays a role, if more relevant, in the whole system, participating in the procedures of selection, organs and maintenance of donors, the process of allocation, collection and transplantation of the transplant in the first person in the elaboration and intervention execution of the pre and post transplant assistance paths
