Contents

A mass casualty incident is an incident in which emergency medical services resources are overwhelmed by the number and severity of casualties. The success or failure of responses to mass casualty incidents depends on the cooperation of many sectors – health professionals, communications, transportation, law and order, social services, and other nonhealth sectors. Coordination should be institutionalised not only at the level of national ministries, but, ultimately most important, at the local level of communities. As the largest component of the health care workforce, nurses represent a significant resource that can be called on to act as first responders during a mass casualty.
