Advanced Labour Law

Learning objectives

By means of an in-depth study of the fundamental rules governing labour relations in the Italian legal system, the course aims to provide students with the notions and logical schemes necessary to better understand the legal devices that regulate the world of work. Without neglecting the theoretical foundations, a practical approach is therefore favoured, enabling the comprehension of problematic aspects that may arise in everyday labour relations, both on the demand and supply sides. In this way, students can acquire a set of skills that are easily spendable throughout their professional life, regardless of the type of activity carried out (subordinate, self-employed or entrepreneurial).

Contents

The course is mainly focused on the regulation of individual employment relations

Detailed program

- Outlines of trade union law (in particular, collective agreements)
- Working and employment contracts (subordinate, self-employed, remote-work, so called "non-standard" contracts)
- The employer's powers (directive, control, disciplinary) and their limits
- The employer's duties (wage, health and safety, transparency, non-discrimination...)
- The emplyee's duties (diligence, obedience, loyalty, working time...)
- The suspension of working relations
- Dismissals (individual and collective)
- Outsourcing (secondment, subcontracting, transfer of undertaking)

- Waivers and settlements of rights arising from mandatory rules
- The statute of limitations for labour claims
- Outlines of social security law

Prerequisites

No mandatory prerequisites, although a basic knowledge of private law may facilitate the underrstanding of the topics covered

Teaching methods

Teaching is mainly delivered through lectures and interaction with students. In-class exercises will also be provided, with the possibility of agreeing on seminar sessions

Assessment methods

Learning is tested by oral examination, with open questions on the course topics and possible interaction with the lecturer on specific topics
