2: Knowledge and skills useful to understand and change the relations among individuals and the psychosocial processes underlying groups, organizations and social systems

Learning objectives

Knowledge and understanding

- Caregiver-infant interactions
- Parental sensitivity
- Infant socio-emotional development
- Parenting and infant developmental risk conditions

Applying knowledge and understanding

- To identify interaction styles
- To identify emotional regulation between caregiver and infant in the first years of life
- To evaluate interactive problems in the parent-infant dyad
- Principles of early intervention to support parenting in at-risk conditions

Contents

This course aims to provide students with theoretical concepts, methodological principles and an introduction to techniques for the observation and assessment of parent-infant interaction in typical and at-risk developmental conditions.

Detailed program

- Theoretical introduction - The emotional interaction and regulation.
- Caregiver-child emotional regulation: the Still Face methodology in typical development and developmental risk
- Parenting strategies to support interaction.
- Attachment and relationship building.
- Caregiver-child emotional regulation in atypical development (observation of the impact of symptoms on interaction)
- Caregiver-child emotional regulation in atypical development (observation of strategies to support interaction)

Prerequisites

- Basic knowledge of attachment theory
- Knowledge of emotional development basic concepts

Teaching methods

Teaching methods include interactive lessons with guided review of videorecordings of caregiver/child-infant interaction and case discussion.

Assessment methods

The assessment of students' participation will depend upon the modality of lessons (physical presence or remote connection). The 75% of participation is needed. This will include remote activities and the production of homeworks on the themes treated during the lessons.
