Short description

The module is organized into two sections. In the first section, titled "Inequality and the City," the issue of the city as a privileged context for the manifestation of social inequalities is addressed. This includes an examination of both the mechanisms generating inequality and the ways it is expressed in urban space. Specifically, there will be introductory sessions on the topic in general, as well as thematic sessions on specific cases. The module aims to provide doctoral students with an analytical framework to understand urban phenomena within the broader context of inequality, facilitated by discussions on particularly interesting case studies.

The second section, "Manufacturing in the Post-Fordist City," is dedicated to reinterpreting the relationship between the city and manufacturing production. The goal of this section is to rethink categories for analyzing the relationship between the city/urban space and manufacturing production in the post-Fordist city.
