Short description

AIMS/OBJECTIVES

The course presents the essential coordinates of the history and evolution of the Italian and European school system, useful for a historical-critical reflection able to make teachers more aware of the transformations that have defined the profile of today's school, a complex institution consisting of spaces, time, teaching tools, material culture, subjects, teachers, pupils, parents and technical-administrative staff.

The evolution of the school system and educational institutions in Italy and Europe is analysed in terms of its relationship with politics, society and the economy, with particular attention to the development of educational institutions in Italy between the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries.

The course has the following objectives of knowledge and understanding:

- 1. Knowledge of the main historical-educational transformations of the Italian school from the Unification to the present day, with references to the historical-educational transformations of the European school;
- 2. Knowledge of innovative pedagogical thought in terms of the history of ideas and experimentation in the Italian school;
- 3. Knowledge of the history of teacher training, in particular secondary school teachers;
- 4. Understanding of the relationship between the current situation of the Italian school and its history;
- 5. Understanding of the main educational issues in specific European contexts in the light of the historical period analysed;
- 6. Understanding of the connection between the conception of childhood and adolescence and the educational-institutional structure gradually assumed by Italian and European schools.

PROGRAMME

The course programme envisages the delivery of 3 lessons of 4 hours each with the following topics:

First module (6 hours - 1 CFU) - The history of Italian schools and educational institutions between the nineteenth and twentieth centuries

Second module (6 hours - 1 CFU) - In-depth thematic analysis with particular attention to teacher training and a comparison between the Italian context and the European context.

Students enrolled in the first module only will conclude attendance with the break in the middle of the second lesson.

METHODOLOGIES AND TOOLS

The course includes lectures, discussion sessions and other active methodologies.

The lectures will be presented in some cases with the use of PowerPoint, short films, selected readings, analysis of images and documents.

ASSESSMENT METHODS

A minimum attendance of 70 per cent is required to be admitted to the final test.
