Aims

Provide basic training on the phenomenon of eating disorders in the multiplicity of its facets.

To offer a targeted knowledge on the therapeutic responses prepared by the Health System to counteract its spread.

Highlight the heuristic potential of the anthropological-medical approach and clinical ethnography.

Contents

Eating disorders (DCA) are a real social emergency. Their diffusion in Western countries to advanced capitalism questions the articulation between the food system, the nutrition clinic, representations of corporeity and current forms of psychic distress. In turn, the search for an adequate therapeutic response to their resolution brings to light the Cartesian foundation of the Western medical system, trying to overcome its limits, both clinical and political

The evolution of care models: from single disciplinary to "integrated multidisciplinary".
