COURSE SYLLABUS

Gender-Based Medicine

Aims

To know the principles on which public health is based and how to prevent the most common diseases.

To know and be able to offer gynaecological screening and vaccination programmes on the female population of childbearing age and on the child population; as well as the main gynaecological diagnostic methods, benign gynaecological pathologies, sexually transmitted diseases and pelvic static problems.

To know the fundamentals of effective communication and the most appropriate tools in the process of adult education.

The student will know the role of the midwife in the community and the related educational competence in the prevention and promotion of gender health.

Contents

The course provides knowledge of the main benign diseases of the female genital tract, sexually transmitted diseases, and pelvic static problems.

The course provides the principles of public health and the fundamentals of health education.

At the end of the course, students will develop a basic understanding of the main determinants of population health and epidemiological research methods for analysing these determinants. The role of the midwife in the community and the related educational competence in the promotion of gender health and family planning will also be addressed.

The course provides knowledge of the main skin diseases and the fundamentals of effective communication.

Assessment method

The final exam is intended to assess the acquisition of knowledge and understanding of the program content, and to test the ability to apply it with clinical reasoning and care planning.

It consists of a written test followed by an oral examination.

The written test consists of closed-ended questions (true/false, matching, multiple-choice quizzes) and short open-ended questions on the content covered in the following Didactic Units:

- Community Midwife
- Public health
- Skin and venereal diseases

The oral examination involves the discussion of all written tests and an interview on the topics covered in class in the following Didactic Units:

- Public Health
- Gynecology
