Law for Tourism

Learning objectives

The course intends to analyze private law aspects of tourism law and the relationships between travellers and the professional operators.

Contents

Through the analysis of the most significant National and European decisions, the aim of the module shall be the study of the sources of tourism law; of the entities and operators involved in the touristic activities; of the touristic contracts; entities which offer accommodation services; mooring and pleasure yachting contracts; air and maritime carriage; contractual liability and dispute resolution methods.

Detailed program

1. The sources- European law of tourism – International conventions on tourism
2. The players of the touristic activity – The traveller; the Tour Operator; Travel Agencies; Touristic Organizations
3. Touristic Contracts – Contracts of carriage; Denied boarding, Cancellation and delay; Cruise contracts; Voyage Contract; Packages; Booking; Accommodation; Bailment and deposit in Hotel.
4. Pleasure yachting contracts
5. Civil Liability and touristic activity – Contractual liability;
6. Tort liability;
7. Ruined vacation damage
