Learning objectives

The course is designed to acquire knowledge of the principles and institutions of the legal system, beginning with the constitutional system.

In particular, the main goals are:

- introducing to the study of the production of legislation;
- describing the organization and activity of the institutions of the Italian Republic and the European Union;
- analyzing the fundamental rights:
- presenting the framework of public intervention in the economy;

Contents

The course aims to develop a full awareness of the instruments of political participation and protection of personal rights. It also analyses the functioning of the Italian Republic, the European Union and territorial autonomies. The main profiles of economic law are then treated, with specific zoom in on administrations and public intervention in the economy.

Prerequisites

Knowledge of Italian and European history. Knowledge of the essentials of civic education

Teaching methods

Mainly face-to-face lectures; there may be some seminars and some more interactive activities. It is planned to deliver up to 30 percent of the lectures remotely.

Assessment methods

Oral tests, usually consisting of three questions on the main topics of the course. The three questions are intended to test the consistence of the student preparation so each question covers a different part of the course. Midterm tests in written form may be scheduled on some topics covered during lectures.
