Contents

By the end of the course students will be expected to: recognize the key areas of social psychology, demonstrate a basic knowledge of the major theoretical frameworks in social psychology and demonstrate a basic knowledge of the relationship between theoretical perspectives and research methodologies.

- The social and cultural origins of Social Psychology
- Main theoretical models in Social Psychology
- Types of research designs and research methods in social psychology (experimental method, laboratory method, field research, action research);
- The relationships between Social Psychology and other sciences (Physics, Biology, Sociology, Economics, History) – Social Psychology and General Psychology, Psychodynamic Psychology, Clinical Psychology.
- Social Psychology main topics:
 - attitudes,
 - persuasive communication,
 - stereotypes and prejudices,
 - social representations,
 - conformity and social influence processes,
 - group and relationships between groups,
 - social cognition.
