Teaching methods

The lessons will be in the classroom, predominantly in erogative mode. To stimulate active participation, films and documentaries will be viewed and students will be invited to comment. The material or its source of availability will be made available on the e-learning site of the course, so that it can also be used by students not attending the course. One or two lessons will be held in interactive mode and students will be asked to work in groups on a problem with the help of articles and to do a short exposition of their work. This work will be considered for the exam.

Assessment methods

The exam is written and includes closed questions and open questions. The questions are intended to ascertain the actual

acquisition of both theoretical knowledge and the ability to apply such knowledge to the analysis of language phenomena that characterize our daily communication exchanges. The work done during the course will average with the score of the written exam.
