Chinese Language 1

Topics and course structure

Introduction to Mandarin Chinese

The course aims at introducing students to both written and spoken Mandarin Chinese, starting from the most basic elements of the language:

Characters' classification and writing

Chinese phonology

Pinyin transcription system

How to use paper dictionaries

The course will also touch upon basic grammatical features of the language.

Practice of basic-level listening and speaking skills. Students will be introduced to reading and translating simple texts.

Objectives

Through constant attendance to the lessons and to the Laboratory connected to the course (APPLICATIONS OF CHINESE LANGUAGE 1), students will reach the A2 level (CEFR).

Such level will provide students with the necessary skills to sit for the HSK level 2 exam.

Students will be able to speak, understand and read basic texts in Standard Chinese.

Methodologies

The course will be held in Italian and in Chinese.

Teaching methodology is predominantly interactive, with a few number of lectures.

In case of special teaching needs, one or two recorded lectures will be made available on the e-learning platform in asynchronous mode.

The lecturer's lessons follow a completely interactive methodology, with some oral and written production activities conducted directly by the students with the lecturer's supervision.

Programme and references

Standard Mandarin Chinese

This first year course emphasizes writing in both characters and pinyin (phonetic system). Moreover, it serves as an introduction to basic grammar structures.

Chinese characters writing exercises, reading comprehension and basic translation techniques.

The course will also provide guidelines to reading and translating very simple texts. At the end of the course, students will be able to introduce themselves and ask basic personal questions, reading basic texts and searching for characters they do not know.

Assessment methods

There will be no on-going assessment, but one final test divided into two parts:

- written (grammar test, reading comprehension, translation {Chinese-Italian and Italian-Chinese} of sentences or short passages. The use of dictionaries is not permitted.)
- oral (listening and speaking, reading comprehsion, grammar questions, questions about the compulsory readings)

- ** To sit for the oral exam, you must have passed the written exam. **
- ** The written exam is valid for one year **, after which it is necessary to pass it again in order to access the oral exam.

ONLY those who have properly registered for the exam will be admitted to the test. To access the written exam, it is necessary to register for the written exam, to access the oral exam, please register for the oral exam.
