Course title

General pedagogy laboratory

Topics and course structure

The laboratory, combined with the General Pedagogy Course, is centered on the observation as a professional tool for educators and teachers in educational and school contexts.

Observation in educational and school contexts is addressed in a practical and targeted way thanks to direct activities (observations conducted on films, etc.) and exercises managed individually and in groups, analysis of observation protocols, etc.

The workshops take place during the General Pedagogy course (end of October - December of the first semester) and last 12 hours.

Various laboratory shifts are planned to ensure that students can choose times and days compatible with any other commitments.

The workshop calendar and registration methods are communicated during the course.

Participation in all meetings is the condition for having approved the laboratory and being able to access the written test for the General Pedagogy exam.

Objectives

With the constant and participatory attendance at the Laboratory connected to the course, we intend to promote:

- knowledge of the observation tool and its applications in an educational context;
- understanding the centrality of observation in the educational and teaching-learning process;

- the development of an observational attitude and competence in students and female students.

Methodologies

Individual and group exercises, video observations, analysis of observational protocols, discussion.

Online and offline teaching materials

Students have at their disposal a handout on the subject of observation in educational and school contexts which is part of the exam bibliography. The Handout is useful for introducing theory on the subject of observation and its use in educational and school contexts.

During the course, two lessons are dedicated to the subject of observation in order to guarantee all students theoretical and methodological knowledge useful for actively participating in the workshops.
