COURSE SYLLABUS

The New Dentist, The Order and The Regional Rules

Aims

This educational activity is offered to the new odontologist that, after the qualification and the following enrollment in the roll of one's own professional register, finds themselves in front of a complex professional track, with professional ethical duties as well as duties of organisation of one's own activity.

The goal of this teaching is therefore clarifying these fields by involving fifth- and sixth-year students in a series of frontal lectures (or other useful methods) focused on giving the essential skills on those topics, giving pieces of useful information in order to enter the world of work, respecting the professional accuracy.

Contents

- 1 - To obtain essential elements of professional ethics in order to adapt the professional behaviour once in the register of Odontologists in one's own Register;
- 2 - To obtain regulatory-field elements in compliance with the correct opening, organisation and management of a dental practice;
- 3 - Strategies of contributory choices in the social security field.

Detailed program

The programme of the course includes:

1. The professional register: tasks and functions (historical overview, organisation, goals)

2. The code of professional conduct and the professional ethics (focusing especially on those articles that are specific for Odontology)
3. Duties of a member (general, of education, of decorum, professionalism, competence, caution, of proper relationship with the patient, of conformity with the civil rules connected to the profession, etc.)
4. The world of work (opening, organisation and management of a professional practice, the healthcare responsibility, unregulated and front man-regulated activities, healthcare informational advertisement, etc.)
5. The disagreement and the professional insurance protection
6. The social security institution (ENPAM) and the supplementary pension
7. In-depth analyses about rising details

Prerequisites

The course is aimed to fifth- and sixth-year students who are preparing to enter the world of work once they acquire the clinical skills of the profession.

Lectures will be held in a frontal mode and/or online.
