Aims

This course aims to expand students' communication skills by providing both theoretical knowledge and practical strategies for delivering and receiving effective feedback and managing conflicts in healthcare settings.

Contents

This unit will guide students in analyzing common barriers to effective feedback in work settings, appreciating the importance of cultivating a positive feedback culture, and exploring strategies to formulate and use functional feedback effectively. Additionally, basic theoretical notions and practical strategies for recognizing and tackling conflicts in healthcare settings will be discussed.

Detailed program

The following contents will be covered:

- How to provide and receive feedback: what works, what doesn't, and why. Theoretical notions about feedback.
- How to foster a positive feedback culture: the Johari Window and the MACRO YES model.
- Managing challenging conversations: theory and practical tips on how to manage criticisms and negative feedback.
- General overview of workplace-based assessment methods in clinical supervision: supervisor and trainee perspectives.
- Don't panic: it is just a conflict! Basic notions and practical strategies to tackle conflicts in the workplace.
