Abdominal Surgery

Aims

The course will explore the abdominal pathologies of surgical interest. The lessons will provide the student the necessary knowledge on the general management of a surgical patient, including the indications, contraindications and preoperative evaluation. Surgical techniques will also be explored with a focus on surgical anatomy and we will also cite the expected outcomes of the operations together with the post-operative management. The clinical internship will provide students with the necessary skills of communication with patient and relatives, familiarity with the basic surgical maneuvers and with the main surgical operations. The interaction with nurses, residents, senior doctors, as much as with the other students will foster their relational competence, essential for the future work of interaction with colleagues.

Contents

Main analysis and understanding of the surgical aspects and management of the GI disorders

Detailed program

(Shared with the course Surgery part of the Digestive Health and with the course Gastroenterology and Hepatology IV within Clerkship 9)

General aspects of perioperative medicine: nutritional, infective and clinical management of patients undergoing surgical evaluation for operation.

Acute abdomen: clinical features, assessment and surgical management of peritonitis, intestinal occlusion and hemoperitoneum.

Abdominal hernias: anatomy, physiopathology, natural history and surgical repair of inguinal and incisional hernias.

Indications and surgical management of splenic diseases

Knowledge of the preparatory courses as indicated in the regulations of the degree course in Medicine and Surgery

Teaching form

The clerkship sessions will alternate practical sessions (in the surgical wards, in the outpatient clinic and in the operating room) and interactive activities as follows: frontal lessons with interactive presentation and discussion.
