The course has two main objectives:

giving tools for knowledge and analysis of some empirical domains in which social and economic relations, and their transformations, are particularly relevant today

The foundational economy
The environmental crisis and the global capitalism

Detailed program

The first part of the course provides the basic elements for the sociological study of economic phenomena, presenting and discussing the most important approaches in classical theories.

Afterwards we will outline yhe main features of the welfare state and of the so called financial capitalism.

Then we will deepen a specific current approach (the foundational economy) and will discuss its potential of analysis by referring in particular to the Italian case.

The third part of the course is devoted to discussion on environmental crisi on global capitalism
