Learning objectives

The course intends to deepen some current topics of public action in the economic field. In order to provide an overview of the problems currently affecting the intervention of public authorities in the economy, the program is divided into the examination of the regulatory framework and the administrative aspects related to economic relations and businesses.

The framing of constitutional principles in the economic field and the relationship between the market model and the form of the welfare state. Public services and in particular their organization and management modalities. The public discipline antitrust.
