Demography and Tourism

Learning objectives

The course has two distinct objectives. The first is an in-depth study of the socio-demographic dynamics in countries with advanced and poor economic development. In particular, the relationships between different economic and social contexts and the intensity and quality of tourist flows will be highlighted.

The second objective is to increase competence in retrieving and using national and international tourism, economic and social indicators. The training activity includes constant reference to the application aspects of the topics covered using nationally and internationally available data and materials.

Detailed program

The course has two objectives. The first is the in-depth study of social and demographic dynamics by providing the tools to assess and interpret the manifestations and causes of the world's social and demographic differences. The

comparison of the sociodemographic conditions of developed and poor countries allows for a full highlighting of the similarities and differences in the world's historical and contemporary sociodemographic processes.

The second objective is pursued by assuming the aforementioned dynamics as determinants of tourist flows' intensity and quality. In particular, different countries' economic and social conditions will be related to the tourism phenomenon. This objective is intended to increase competence in acquiring and using national and international tourism, economic and social indicators.

The training activity includes constant reference to the application aspects of the topics covered using nationally and internationally available data and materials.
