Models and Techniques for assessing psychological functioning

Learning objectives

Knowledge and Understanding

- ? Learn the characteristics of effective and appropriate communication in the context of the relationship with the patient.
- ? Learn the characteristics of effective and appropriate communication in the context of relations with healthcare professionals (doctors, nurses, healthcare assistants, rehabilitation therapists, etc.) within a team working environment.
- ? Recognize the critical elements in communication and relations with different patients based on their life cycle stage, clinical condition, and sociocultural context, with attention to transcultural aspects.
- ? Deepen knowledge in specific areas of specialist communication within the hospital setting.

Ability to Apply Knowledge and Understanding

- ? Develop communication and relational skills useful for working with patients in the healthcare setting in general, and specifically in hospitals.
- ? Develop communication and relational skills useful for collaboration between the psychologist and the healthcare team.
- ? Develop specialized communication and relational methods in specific areas of organic disease based on life cycle stages.

Contents

- Introduction to hospital psychology and the role of the psychologist in healthcare settings.
- Communication and patient relationship: basic principles and advanced strategies.
- Communication with the healthcare team: interdisciplinary collaboration and conflict management.
- Specific communication aspects in certain clinical conditions (e.g., chronic illnesses, acute conditions, end-of-life situations).
- Elements of transcultural communication in hospital settings.
- Practical exercises and clinical case simulations.

Detailed program

- **Introduction to Hospital Psychology:** the role of the hospital psychologist, intervention models, integration with the healthcare team.
- **Communication with the Patient:** active listening techniques, empathy, managing patient anxiety, communicating diagnoses.
- **Communication with the Healthcare Team:** interdisciplinary collaboration, managing hospital dynamics, strategies to facilitate cooperation.
- **Managing Emotions in Hospital Settings:** emotional self-assessment, stress management, burnout, and coping strategies.
- **Psychology of Pain and Chronic Illnesses:** psychological support for patients with chronic pain, coping strategies.
- **Communication with Families:** managing the emotions of family members, strategies for supporting difficult news delivery.
- **Final Discussion and Case Study Presentations:** synthesis of learning, feedback on laboratory experiences.

Prerequisites

Basic knowledge of **clinical psychology** and **psychodiagnostics** is recommended.

Teaching methods

- **Lecture-based teaching** (frontal lessons): 8 hours
- **Interactive teaching** (discussions, simulations, group work, case analyses): 20 hours
- Fully in-person teaching

Assessment methods

The participation in 70% of the lessons is required. Students must submit a written report on a clinical case presented during class.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Clarity and appropriateness in describing communicative dynamics in hospital settings.
- Ability to apply effective communication strategies in simulated contexts.

- Critical reflection and analysis of clinical cases.
