Migrations from/to the Global South

Module description

Migration is among the most controversial and debated contemporary phenomena. The fundamental right to move is contrasted with public policies and rhetoric that stigmatise migration, particularly those generated by disadvantaged conditions. What tools does cultural and social anthropology provide us with to approach these dynamics? The module provides an introduction, both critical and non-specialist, to the study of migration from the perspective of the Global South. Through an anthropological perspective, and the study of some concrete case studies, contemporary mobility dynamics will be understood in their cultural, socio-economic, political and existential complexity.

Learning goals

The aim is to bring about an understanding of migration as a historical and socio-political phenomenon, encouraging critical reflection on the importance of migration as a factor of socio-cultural, economic and political change.
