Thinking through democracy

Module description

The module aims to provide an introduction, both critical and non-specialist, to the main philosophical models of democracy present in the contemporary debate. Through the study of some of the main theories proposed in the last decades (deliberative democracy, agnostic democracy, lottery democracy, populism, disagreement democracy, post-democracy), the lectures will allow students to develop a critical understanding of current theories and practices of representative democracy, and assess the strengths and weaknesses of alternative proposals.

Learning goals

The aim of the module is to provide an understanding of some of the main theories of democracy in the contemporary debate, stimulating critical reflection on current conceptions and practices of democracies.

General goal

To encourage critical reflection on the meaning of the democratic ideal understood as the power to govern oneself and to actively participate in life in common, and on the contemporary practices in which this ideal is, or is not, embodied.
