Learning area

II. Learning Area: Acquisition of practical and theoretical knowledge and techniques functional to the profession of interpreter and translator between spoken and sign languages, also in the international sphere

Learning objectives

Knowledge and understanding

Know and understand the basic vocabulary and structures of International Sign for simple interactions, including the main parameters of signing, initial use of space and grammatical facial expressions.

Ability to apply knowledge and understanding

Apply basic International Sign vocabulary and structures to communicate in everyday situations, with essential use of sign parameters, space and simple clarification strategies.

Autonomy of judgement

Essentially evaluate the clarity and appropriateness of one's own productions and apply simple self-correction and clarification strategies.

Communication skills

Interact in predictable everyday situations, understanding and producing short messages (introductions, requests, simple descriptions) and managing the exchange with basic strategies.

Learning skills

Continue learning with increasing autonomy through guided self-assessment, use of resources (videos, glossaries) and application of feedback to improve vocabulary and accuracy.

Contents

- Origin and history of international signs
- Basic everyday IS vocabulary
- Simple grammatical and communicative phenomena

Detailed program

- Introduction (name, basic personal information, greetings, introductions, spatial description of the person, personal pronouns)
- Questions (of total and partial ignorance) and explanations (indirectly or directly, how to ask something, giving reasons and clarifications)
- Statement of preferences, likes and dislikes.
- Positioning and description of objects
- Contrastive structure
- Numbers
- Beginning of Special Oral Components (SOC) and Borrowed Word Images (BWI)
- Phrasal structures in specific contexts
- Lexical expansion and respective variants

Teaching methods
