### European History and History Teaching 2

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#### Course title

Historical culture and the problems and methods of the didactics of history.

The course is in Italian.

#### Topics and course structure

Updating of background on general history and historical culture/epistemology. Issues and methods of History teaching. Awareness of how historical knowledge helps to understand the world we live in.

The lectures do not illustrate the texts in the bibliography, but address supplementary epistemological, methodological and historical issues.

#### Objectives

Updating of historical and historiographical notions. Developing awareness and methods of teaching history.

In the conviction that the understanding of didactic methods cannot be separated from critical awareness of the diverse disciplinary areas and contents, the course has two main purposes:

1. strengthen the students' historical culture by offering fundamental concepts of reference and advanced notions, beyond the level proposed by ordinary textbooks and appropriate for an active didactic approach (social, cultural and material history)- Dublin Descriptor: Knowledge and Understanding;
2. develop the students' interest in History - a subject whose significance may not have been fully appreciated in school - and their critical awareness of the purposes and of the problems and methods of history

teaching, creating opportunities to refine their competences and analytical skills in the planning of well-grounded and inclusive educational activities (Dublin Descriptor: Applying Knowledge and Understanding; Making judgements).

## Methodologies

Lectures (70%) interactive workshops and discussion (30%), in person.

## Online and offline teaching materials

Online teaching materials and recordings are promptly provided after the lectures.

## Assessment methods

No tests during the course. Written exam completed with an optional brief oral examination if needed. An optional written exam is available at the end of the course.

A slightly different exam is available, particularly suggested for students who cannot attend the course or listen to the recordings of lectures: this is a written exam on texts only plus oral exam on history and historiography.

The written exam, which allows an objective assessment, includes fifteen multiple choice questions on the programme and three "open questions", which will be answered with short essays. For attending students, these open questions concern the subjects treated in the lectures and interactive workshops.

A good understanding of the different aspects of a historical and historiographical vision of reality is a crucial requirement (see Objectives).
