G8501R041 - *M/PED 03 - Workshop 1- Reading and Writing: from Process to Practice*

Topics and course structure

Workshop 1 topics:

- The conceptualization process of written languages: analisys of surveys on the writing of pre-school and primary school childrens
- The evolution of writing skills in relations to the teacher's feedbacks
- The role of the anticipation in the reading process
- Purpose and strategies of reading: teaching implications

Objectives

Through the workshop the students will have the opportunity to connect theories and practice through teamwork focused on literacy practices and learning of the written language.

Workshop 1 goals:

- To know how to survey levels of written conceptualization
- To know how to assess levels of writing conceptualization
- To know how to provide effective feedback on texts to promoting writing skills
- To know how to plan anticipational activities to promote reading skills
- Identify textual properties to plan anticipational activities

- To reflect on personal experiences of teaching in linguistic areas (if teaching) or on internship experience related to the issues faced during the course
- Promote the active participation and critical thinking of the students

Methodologies

Workshop 1 is a 12 hours required attendance corse (the absences are governed by the laboratory regulations)

- Work on small teams
- Teamworks
- Work in pairs
- Discussion
- Simulation of teaching activities
