# First Foreign Language - French

### Learning objectives

1. Knowledge and understanding

Objectives: The course aims to

acquire the linguistic, communicative, and metalinguistic knowledge and skills required by level B1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

achieve an intermediate level of knowledge of French grammar (simple sentences: main verb tenses, pronouns, prepositions, negation, interrogative form).

understand the thematic vocabulary related to everyday situations.

develop understanding of authentic texts (articles, fact sheets, graphs, interviews).

#### 2. Ability to apply knowledge and understanding

Objectives: The course aims to:

introduce students to oral and written comprehension of foreign language productions, with short written and oral exercises that reinforce grammatical knowledge.

use listening and comprehension activities with audio/video recordings by native speakers.

develop, through the use of authentic material, the application of such content to statements and speeches with specialized linguistic value.

#### 3. Independence of judgment

Objectives

Develop the ability to reflect on language use and one's own learning strategies.

Argue simple opinions, preferences, and points of view.

Encourage discussion on socio-economic issues related to France through summaries, graphs, and questions.

#### 4. Communication skills

Objectives

Express oneself clearly and comprehensibly, both orally and in writing, on familiar topics or topics of personal interest.

Interact with relative spontaneity with native speakers.

Give a short presentation on a familiar topic.

Encourage oral and written production on guided topics.

#### 5. Learning skills

The student will be able to:

Use the language correctly in simple everyday and professional contexts.

Write coherent and cohesive texts (informal letters, emails, notes, descriptions, short arguments).

Produce comparative analyses between French language and culture and the language and culture of the mother tongue.

### **Detailed program**

The topics covered during French language lessons and examined in tests are as follows:

- 6. Demonstrative adjectives and pronouns

- 9. Relative pronouns
- 10. The use of en and y
- 11. Comparatives
- 12. Superlatives
- 13. Indefinite adjectives and pronouns
- 14. Interrogative, negative, and interrogative-negative forms
- 15. Auxiliary verbs (use)
- 16. The indicative mood (present, future, imperfect, past tense, pluperfect, future perfect)
- 17. The imperative mood
- 18. Agreement of the past participle (with the auxiliary verbs être, avoir and reflexive verbs)
- 19. Formation of adverbs
- 20. Use of prepositions
- 21. Gallicisms (near future, recent past, present progressive)

# **Prerequisites**

The written test is preparatory to the oral exam.

### **Teaching methods**

During the lessons, the presentation of

- a) linguistic content
- b) related to the culture and vocabulary of the specialized language (lecture mode) is alternated with interaction with students in various language production activities (interactive mode).

The course includes

21 two-hour lessons delivered in lecture format in the initial part, which aims to involve students interactively in the subsequent part. Lessons are held in Italian and French.

Activities are carried out in person. If necessary and at the request of students, lessons may be held remotely.

#### **Assessment methods**

The French test consists of:

a written test taken in the computer lab consisting of 30 multiple-choice or open-ended grammar questions (duration: 35 minutes).

The written test is graded on a scale of 30. Each correct answer is worth one point; incorrect answers are not penalized

An oral test: students must choose 6 sections from the 12 in the compilation. They must bring the list of selected texts and the handout to the exam. The teacher chooses some of the texts prepared by the student, who must demonstrate that they have read and understood them by answering questions and summarizing their content.
