Course title

CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY II (Advanced)

Topics and course structure

The course aims to provide the students with theoretical and practical tools for a proper interpretation of clinical phenomena in different educational contexts.

The course divides into 2 parts: fundamental and thematic.

In the first one, the actual debate on the epistemological status of clinical psychology (natural vs. human science), particularly regarding the relationship between clinical psychology and neuroscience.

The second part focuses on some tools and models of intervention, deriving from systemic and constructivist psychology, applicable in different educational contexts.

Main topics

- Clinical Psychology: a human or a natural science?
 Critical dialogue with neuroscience.
- 2. Constructivist and Systemic approaches and family therapy
 - a) Understanding of psychiatric diagnosis
 - b) Understanding of hermeneutic diagnosis
 - c) Application of systemic principles to educational contexts

Objectives

This course aims to support the following learning outcomes in particular:

Knowledge and understanding

- Develop a critical and articulated understanding of the psychological, family, and socio-cultural dynamics that produce typical or atypical phenomena;
- Acquiring knowledge of theoretical, methodological, and psychological-clinical intervention approaches in different pedagogical-educational contexts.

Applied knowledge and understanding

- Applying knowledge and skills to address psycho-pedagogical issues in dialogue with other professionals (in particular clinical psychologists and psychotherapists), connecting theory and practice;
- Design and evaluate pedagogical contexts and experiences in collaboration with psychologists and psychotherapists.

Autonomy of judgment

- Acquire and consolidate analytical and critical thinking skills in pedagogical-educational situations, taking reflective ethical and epistemological positions in comparison with psychological-clinical knowledge. Communication skills*
- Develop the ability to communicate effectively (especially in writing) the logic and criteria of pedagogicaleducational interventions, especially to professional partners in the field of psychology, mastering the language and conceptual categories.
- Knowledge of the specific language and vocabulary of clinical psychology, with particular reference to pedagogical-educational contexts. *Learning skills*
- Ability to rework and organize knowledge;
- Ability to identify methods and tools to support one's own and others' personal and professional growth.

Methodologies

The course is taught in Italian.

- 1. Lectures
- 2. Cases studies
- 3. Work in a small group
- 4. Work on videos

Classes will be held in-person (unless otherwise decided by the University).
