Learning area

I. Learning area: Acquisition of language skills in LIS, LIST and Italian

Learning objectives

Knowledge and comprehension

- Reinforcement of language skills to reach a B1 (where possible B2) level at the end of the course.
- Preparation for reaching the C1 level, an expected goal for the next course.
- Acquisition of strategies for using the Italian language in varied professional contexts, such as the profession for which they are training.

Ability to apply knowledge and understanding.

- Development of the ability to produce written texts on various topics, with emphasis on grammatical correctness and clarity of exposition.
- Stimulation of reading complex texts for vocabulary expansion and analysis of certain language structures.
- Identification and overcoming of emotional filters that hinder language learning, through reflection and self-analysis exercises.

Making Judgements

Students will be able to critically evaluate the communicative and logical coherence of complex texts. They will be capable of selecting the most reliable sources for drafting a paper.

Communication Skills

By the end of the course, students will be able to produce written texts characterized by appropriate register, terminological precision, and complex syntactic structure. They will be able to adapt style according to the target audience (academic, professional, or general public).

Learning Skills

Students will develop self-correction skills through the regular use of Italian language dictionaries, as well as dictionaries of synonyms and antonyms. This habit of self-monitoring will enable them to independently verify the accuracy of their word choices and grammatical correctness, ensuring clear, precise writing suited to various professional environments.

Contents

- Introduction to Italian for use in formal and informal contexts.
- Writing exercises on personal and professional topics, with individual feedback.
- Tailored grammar instruction based on common student errors, with a personalized approach.
- Expansion of vocabulary through reading and discussion of texts.

Detailed program

- Course introduction and objectives; visualization exercises to identify future language needs; analysis of CEFR levels with a focus on B1 and B2. Emotional exercise to explore personal relationships with the Italian language.
- Circular, interdependent lessons: text reading and lexical analysis (Thursday), and written production (Friday), feedback to students with a focus on grammar based on common errors (Tuesday).
- Development of strategies for revising one's own work.
- Consolidation of skills to achieve level B1 (B2); preparation for writing on current events; introduction to the skills required for level C1 in preparation for the next course.

Prerequisites

Basic proficiency in Italian equivalent to at least CEFR Level A2.

Teaching methods

- Lecture-Based Instruction (13 hours): Lectures with in-depth coverage of grammatical rules and linguistic structures.
- Interactive Instruction (50 hours): Writing exercises, collaborative corrections, and group discussions. Use of Google Drive for drafting texts, revision, and real-time feedback.
- Individual Activities: One written text per week to practice writing and reflect on grammatical rules.

Assessment methods

The exams will be administered in written format only.

Textbooks and Reading Materials

Teaching materials and additional resources will be available on Google Drive to make it easier to access corrections and feedback.
