Learning objectives

- acquire knowledge of the fundamentals of private law through the study of the Civil Code
- equip themselves with the basic tools for understanding and communicating the fundamental issues of private law
- acquire institutional knowledge and understanding of fundamental legal institutions applied to concrete cases
- understand the fundamental links between the norm and the application of the norm in the concrete case
- develop the institutional capacity to analyze the normative text and its application to practical cases
- develop the institutional basic capacity of application of principles to decisions made in the concrete case through analysis of case law

The course is structured as an introduction to Italian Private Law and to the fundamental principles of the Italian Civil Code.

Assessment methods

The final exam is oral, with no partial tests. It provides for a follow-up interview on the topics covered by the exam texts and in class.

The candidate must demonstrate a good knowledge of the key private law institutes and the Civil Code. A preliminary mnemonic study of the basic notions and definitions is also required. Institutions of private law must be presented with accurate terminology. The student must be able to explain the rules and problems that pertain to the main institutes of private law.
