Learning objectives

Knowledge and understanding

Provide a good knowledge of the institutions of public law most directly related to economic dynamics, with a careful look also at European and supranational dynamics

Applying knowledge and understanding

Develop the approaches and methodologies of legal analysis of public law

Making judgements

During the lessons, students will be called to verify the concrete application of the theoretical institutions

Communication skills

The stimulus to comparison will facilitate the ability to communicate what has been learned

Learning skills

During the lessons, students will be called to study some cases discussed in class, in order to enhance their learning ability and to continue studying independently

Contents

This course is concerned with the organization and activity of the Italian Government and other public institutions. The course also provides a juridical and political framework of relations between authorities and rights with particular reference to individuals and social groups' rights. The course then focuses on constitutional transformations.

Detailed program

- The basics of general public law: the legal system States and governments.
- Sources of public law.
- Outline of Italian constitutional history.
- Constitutional organization of the Italian Republic.
- Regions and local governments.
- Rights and duties of the citizens International relationships of the Italian Republic.
- Public economics law: regulation of the market and public intervention in the economy.

Prerequisites

Knowledge of the legal sources of public law and the general organization of the Italian and European legal order.

Teaching methods

The course consists of 72 hours, of which: 51 hours consisting of face-to-face lessons (some of which will be devoted to case discussions and in-depth seminars) and 21 hours in remote

Assessment methods

The exam is oral, on the topics covered in class and in the textbook.

Attending students will be offered the opportunity to participate in two written tests (one intermediate, the other at the end of the course).

The commission will evaluate the degree of knowledge, appropriate use of legal language, critical capacity in the exposition of issues.
