Learning objectives

In relation to the objective of knowledge and understanding:

- To understand the model of restorative justice and the programs that implement it, as well as their application within the Italian legal framework
- To know the main national and international legal sources regulating the application of restorative justice programs
- To understand the principles and characteristics of the restorative paradigm, also in contexts beyond criminal justice, with particular attention to social and community settings
- To understand the role of the mediator and their equidistance (equiprossimità), highlighting the distinctions and interactions between this role and other social professions
- To explore specific contexts of application of the restorative model, both in Italy and abroad, with particular attention to serious and very serious offenses and the experiences of peace justice
- To deepen the understanding of issues related to the experience of victimization

In relation to the objective of applying knowledge and understanding:

- To be able to describe the process of a restorative justice program in all its phases
- To be able to describe the restorative paradigm and conflict mediation
- To experiment with tools used by expert mediators in restorative justice programs, approaching the practical skills required by this professional role
- To be able to take on a role in promoting restorative justice programs in professional settings where there is a legal duty to inform beneficiaries

Prerequisites

No prior knowledge required

Teaching methods

In relation to critical thinking and judgment skills, the following activities are planned:

- Theoretical lectures, always accompanied by classroom debates and group discussions
- In-class exercises allowing students to personally experiment with the concepts learned
- · Role-playing activities with reflective evaluation
- Group work both in and outside the classroom to encourage peer dialogue, always under the supervision of the instructor
- Preparation of written reports

In relation to communication skills:

- Group work involving the analysis of a text and in-class presentation of selected parts to peers, followed by discussion
- Use of diverse modes of expression (legal texts, literary works, audiovisual materials)

In relation to learning skills:

Some lectures will take place in a Milanese correctional facility for adults, with the participation of a group of incarcerated students. This setting is designed to encourage dialogue and the exchange of different perspectives on the complex issue of reparation following the commission of a crime.

The shared learning experience with individuals identified as offenders will enhance students' critical thinking and judgment, improve their communication skills, and provide a broader, more inclusive perspective — valuable for future work in social professions and academic research.

Assessment methods

Student Participation and Assessment

Students will be actively involved in classroom activities, with a strong emphasis on valuing each participant's point of view

During the course, analysis and reading assignments will be given and subsequently presented and discussed in class.

At the end of the course hours, students will be required to submit a short written paper, which will serve as part of the final assessment.

• For attending students:

Based on the content of the lectures, the sessions held at the correctional facility, and the readings assigned by the instructor, students will be asked to prepare a group oral presentation. This will be organized autonomously in small groups and delivered in class.

In addition, students will be required to submit a written group paper as their final exam.

• For non-attending students:

Starting from the readings listed in the "Required Texts" section, students will be asked to write a paper that explains restorative justice and explores a specific aspect of it.

The VOCI (VOICES) found in II Libro dell'Incontro may serve as an interesting starting point.

The student may choose a key concept related to restorative justice or mediation, or a particular theme that resonated with them, and develop a personal analysis.

Alternatively, they may connect their work to a specific case of conflict, imagining a possible mediation process. This case might be taken from personal professional experience (for those already working), or from other contexts such as current events, films, or literature.

The paper should include:

A descriptive short section on restorative justice and mediation (drawing from the assigned texts)

A reflective section, focusing on a personal interpretation, developed from a chosen word, theme, conflict, or even the experience of engaging with the group of incarcerated students at the correctional facility.
