Nursing Clinical Methodology 2

Aims

The course aims to provide the student with knowledge of important human pathologies and the principles for their treatment with surgical, pharmacological and nursing approaches. The main types of surgical intervention and the main classes of drugs of interest to nursing will be covered. The student will know the methods of identifying and responding to the nursing care needs of the person, using the nursing care process in care situations in the field of general surgery. The skills of the community nurse will also be covered, describing the areas in which he or she operates to ensure continuity of care in primary care; the purposes of health and therapeutic education; the implementation and evaluation of a health education intervention. At the end of the course, the student will know the methods of identifying and responding to the nursing care needs of the person, using the nursing care process in care situations in the clinical and territorial field.

Knowledge and understanding - at the end of the Clinical Nursing Methodology 2 course, the student will be able to understand the methods of identifying and responding to the nursing care needs of the person, using the nursing care process in the main care situations.

Ability to apply knowledge and understanding - At the end of the course, the student will be able to apply the methods of identifying and responding to the nursing care needs of the person, using the nursing care process in care situations in the clinical and territorial setting.

Autonomy of judgment - at the end of the course, the student will be able to understand the process of developing a nursing care plan. Know how to put together information from different fields (Pharmacology, General Surgery, General Surgery Nursing and Community Nursing) to understand and formulate the nursing care plan.

Communication skills - at the end of the course the student will have acquired adequate scientific and nursing terminology and will be able to present with proper language the topics covered in the course.

Learning skills - at the end of the course the student will be able to understand and critically evaluate the scientific literature

Contents

The General Surgery module aims to provide the student with the main notions relating to the anatomy and physiology of some of the main organs including: stomach, pancreas, esophagus, colon-rectum, and liver. Their main pathologies and surgical approaches and possible complications will be presented.

The Clinical Pharmacology module will focus on the main classes of drugs that the Nursing student will have to administer during the internship periods and in his professional life. In addition to the most commonly prescribed drugs, such as antibiotics and NSAIDs, drugs active on the central nervous system and the cardiovascular system will also be covered. For each class of drugs, the side effects that the nurse must be able to recognize and report will be highlighted.

The Nursing in Surgery module will focus on the methods of identifying and responding to the nursing care needs of the person, using the nursing care process in the field of general surgery. The main classifications of surgical interventions will be covered in relation to complexity, urgency and purpose and the different ways of taking charge and models of assistance to the person undergoing surgery; the structural, plant, technological and personnel organization within the operating block.

The Community Nursing module aims to prepare the future nurse to evaluate the health status and needs of the person in the different stages of life, promote informative and educational interventions aimed at individuals, families and groups, supervise and facilitate the paths in the different services using the skills present in the network.

Overall, the course aims to implement the skills to promote a multidimensional approach according to a global vision of the concept of health, also promoting awareness of gender differences in the healthcare sector.
