Endoscopic Procedures Digestive, Respiratory

Aims

The elective course: “digestive and respiratory endoscopic procedures” aims to provide nursing students with the in-depth knowledge and caring skills necessary to comprehensively and multidisciplinary manage patients undergoing digestive and respiratory endoscopic procedures, ensuring safety, quality of care, and effective support at all stages of the pathway.

The specific objectives, formulated in accordance with the Dublin Descriptors, are as follows:

1. Knowledge and Understanding

Know the various digestive and respiratory endoscopic procedures, including indications, techniques, and potential complications.

2. Ability to Apply Knowledge and Understanding

Plan and implement comprehensive nursing care for the patient undergoing endoscopic procedures, appropriately managing instruments and equipment.

3. Autonomy of Judgment

Critically assess patient conditions and make autonomous judgments to ensure safety and well-being during endoscopic procedures, collaborating effectively with the team.

4. Communication Skills

Communicate clearly and empathetically with patients, family members, and the multidisciplinary team, providing information and support for endoscopic procedures.

5. Learning Skills

Demonstrate autonomy in continually updating on techniques and guidelines related to the care of patients undergoing digestive and respiratory endoscopy.

Contents

The application of endoscopic technology in the diagnosis, monitoring and non-invasive treatment (compared to a classic surgical treatment) of numerous pathologies of different apparatuses (gastrointestinal, genitourinary, thoracobronchial, etc.) is increasingly required.

The characteristic of invasiveness of such procedures is for the person causing considerable physical and psychological stress, that may increase in relation to age or to basic conditions already weakened or at risk of life and therefore a specific and competent nursing process is required for this purpose.

Persons undergoing endoscopic examinations carry with them fundamental rights such as: the guarantee of the efficiency of the endoscopic instrumentation and implicitly the competence of the user and their knowledge and competence in handling, cleaning and sterilization or other disinfection of endoscopes and their accessories), the safety of environmental hygiene control and equipment as a whole.
