Meeting With Health Care Places in The History of Lombard Territory

Aims

The course aims to introduce students, through guided tours in Lombardy, some places historically dedicated to care and assistance, now no longer active but still documented. These sites, which can be reached by short or medium-length walking trails, are located in natural and territorial contexts of particular environmental value.

In line with the Dublin descriptors, the course aims to:

1. Knowledge and understanding: Acquire knowledge about the historical development of care and assistance places in the Lombardy region. Understand the link between population health needs, care organization and territory.
2. Application of knowledge and understanding: Linking historical and territorial knowledge to current care and assistance contexts. Recognize the socio-health changes that have occurred over time and their implications.
3. Autonomy of judgment: Critically analyze the cultural, ethical and social significance of these places in the history of health. Assess the importance of historical memory in the construction of professional identity.
4. Communicative skills: To be able to describe and share effectively the observations and reflections that emerged during the visits, adapting the language to the type of interlocutor. Collaborate within the group in discussion and content development.
5. Ability to learn: Stimulate curiosity about the evolution of the social health system and promote a lifelong learning attitude. Integrate field experience with theoretical knowledge acquired in the training course.
