Integrated Care Pathway for The Person With Derivative Ostomy

Aims

The elective course "Integrated Path of Care for the Person with Derivative Stomia" aims to allow students to acquire theoretical-practical knowledge and develop professional skills to effectively and individually assist the person with stomia, through the understanding of the educational and care path, the application of specific management techniques, the recognition of complications, appropriate communication and the ability to self-update according to evidence and good practices.

The specific objectives, formulated in accordance with the Dublin Descriptors, are as follows:

1. Knowledge and understanding: to understand the stages of interdisciplinary therapeutic education and the care path of the person with ostomy.
2. Applied knowledge and understanding: apply correct techniques for management of the stoma and peristomal area, using appropriate educational tools.
3. Autonomy of judgment: recognize and assess early and late complications, planning appropriate care interventions.
4. Communicative skills: to communicate effectively with the person affected, family members and the team by adapting language and content.
5. Ability to learn: self-update on good practices and guidelines for ostomy management.
