Aims

At the end of the course the student/s:

- will understand the mechanisms that regulate the human reproductive process, sexuality and contraceptive methods
- will be able to support sexual and reproductive health and promote awareness in reproductive behaviors and choices.

Contents

The course provides knowledge related to sexual and reproductive physiology and contraception, and the skills necessary for evidence-based obstetrical care.

The student will be able to implement woman and couple care through Midwifery Partnership, Midwifery Management, ICF classification and Rating Scales.

Detailed program

- Gender, sexuality, health
- Neurophysiology of female sexual response: normality and dysfunction
- Physiology of the menstrual cycle: menstrual and reproductive health
- Menarche and menopause
- Contraceptive methods. The natural regulation of fertility (RNF). The "Lactation Amenorrhea Method" (LAM).
- Obstetric counseling for family planning and to the couple with fertility problems.
