Short description

This course, offered within the PhD Program in Legal Studies, provides a systematic and interdisciplinary analysis of recent reforms of the justice system, focusing on constitutional, institutional, and procedural dimensions. The course begins with an examination of the constitutional reform of the judiciary and the legislative changes affecting the judicial system, assessing their implications for the balance of powers and for judicial independence. Within this broader framework, it reconstructs major reform trajectories in the Italian legal experience from both a historical and systemic perspective. The analysis then moves across different areas of jurisdiction, addressing the role of the Constitutional Court in shaping tax adjudication and family law, as well as the evolution of criminal protection against gender-based violence. Particular emphasis is placed on mechanisms aimed at enhancing procedural efficiency, such as court-annexed mediation, and on structural principles of adjudication, including judicial impartiality and the adversarial model. The course further considers developments in accounting justice and recent legislative innovations in labour law, ultimately concluding with an examination of restorative justice under the Cartabia reform as an emerging paradigm centered on accountability and conflict resolution.
