The public value of urban space. Theories, policies and practices

2526-Bbetween-TPP-04

Module description

The module will introduce students to the analysis of cities from an anthropological perspective. Particular attention will be paid, on the one hand, to theories that allow us to investigate urban space through a relational approach, understood as something both produced by and producing social relations; on the other hand, to the policies and practices that contribute to shaping it in everyday life and in the nuances of social life. The city of Milan will serve as a case study to explore some issues that have become increasingly central to public debate: housing, segregation, and urban regeneration. Finally, the methodology of action research in urban contexts will be considered as a possible way of conducting research that is attentive to the complexity of reality and social change.

Learning goals

The aim is to promote understanding of urban space as a political and cultural phenomenon, encouraging critical reflection on its importance as a factor of social change.
