Assessment method

There are no intermediate tests.

The final examination consists of a written test followed by a mandatory oral examination.

The written test covers the subjects of Vascular Surgery and Cardiac Surgery, in accordance with the methods described in the two teaching modules. Passing the written test is required in order to access the oral examination. The mark obtained in the written test does not influence the oral examination in General Surgery or the final mark. The oral examination consists of an interview on the topics covered during lectures, as well as topics not addressed in class but included in the syllabus. During the interview, both knowledge of the subject matter and clinical reasoning skills will be assessed.
