Abdominal Surgery

Aims

The course will explore the abdominal pathologies of surgical interest. The lessons will provide the student the necessary knowledge on the general management of a surgical patient, including the indications, contraindications and preoperative evaluation. Surgical techniques will also be explored with a focus on surgical anatomy and we will also cite the expected outcomes of the operations together with the post-operative management. The clinical internship will provide students with the necessary skills of communication with patient and relatives, familiarity with the basic surgical maneuvers and with the main surgical operations. The interaction with nurses, residents, senior doctors, as much as with the other students will foster their relational competence, essential for the future work of interaction with colleagues.

1. Knowledge and Understanding

Acquire knowledge of the main abdominal surgical diseases, including their pathophysiology, clinical presentation, diagnostic work-up, indications and contraindications for surgery, preoperative assessment, surgical anatomy, operative techniques, postoperative management, and the treatment of surgical emergencies.

2. Applying Knowledge and Understanding

Apply theoretical knowledge to the assessment and management of patients with abdominal surgical diseases by participating in clinical clerkship activities, analysing clinical cases, contributing to diagnostic and therapeutic decision-making, and becoming familiar with basic surgical procedures and perioperative care.

3. Making Judgements

Develop the ability to critically evaluate clinical findings, prioritize surgical emergencies, select appropriate diagnostic and therapeutic strategies according to current evidence and clinical guidelines, and recognize the importance of multidisciplinary decision-making in abdominal surgery.

4. Communication Skills

Demonstrate effective communication with patients, their families, and members of the multidisciplinary healthcare

team, applying professional behaviour and appropriate clinical terminology in surgical practice.

5. Learning Skills

Develop autonomous learning skills through participation in clinical clerkships, problem-based learning sessions, multidisciplinary case discussions, and the critical appraisal of current scientific literature and clinical guidelines, fostering lifelong learning in abdominal surgery.

Contents

Main analysis and understanding of the surgical aspects and management of the GI disorders

Detailed program

Shared with the Surgery course part of Digestive Health and with the Gastroenterology and Hepatology IV course within Clerkship 9)

General aspects:

management of the surgical patient and particularly of the critical surgical patient

Surgical emergencies:

-intestinal perforation, intestinal obstruction, hemoperitoneum, acute appendicitis, acute diverticulitis, intestinal ischemia: diagnostic clinical aspects and management in relation to priority classes.

Elective surgery:

- oncological diseases of the upper GI and lower GI, presenting clinical scenarios, diagnostic framework, multimodal therapy
- chronic inflammatory bowel diseases: introduction to surgical aspects
- proctology: anal abscess, anal fistula, hemorrhoids, anal fissure

Prerequisites

Knowledge of the preparatory courses as indicated in the regulations of the degree course in Medicine and Surgery

Teaching form

The clerkship sessions will alternate practical sessions (in the surgical wards, in the outpatient clinic and in the operating room) and interactive activities as follows: frontal lessons with interactive presentation and discussion.
