Aims

The aim of the course is to prepare the tutors that shall be involved in conducting the PBL case discussions during the SMS (School of Medicine and Surgery) course at the ASST-Papa Giovanni XXIII hospital.

Apply the principles of PBL by designing, facilitating, and participating in case-based discussions, using appropriate tutoring strategies to promote active learning, critical thinking, collaborative problem-solving, and self-directed learning.

Develop the ability to critically evaluate the effectiveness of PBL sessions, identify learners' educational needs, provide constructive feedback, and reflect on the strengths and limitations of different teaching methodologies in medical education.

4. Communication Skills

Demonstrate effective communication and facilitation skills in small-group learning environments, promoting constructive interaction, teamwork, active participation, and respectful discussion among participants.

5. Learning Skills

Develop autonomous learning and reflective practice by continuously evaluating personal tutoring performance, integrating educational evidence into teaching practice, and fostering lifelong learning in medical education.
