SYLLABUS DEL CORSO

Donne e Violenza: Prevenzione e Repressione

Learning objectives

The course, available for students since 2019, is the result of a cooperation between the University of Milano-Bicocca and Regione Lombardia in order to promote and realize experimental study programmes on the topic of violence against women.

The course aims at providing a deep knowledge of gender violence in order to let law professionals, especially future judges and lawyers, to knowingly and adequately deal with these matters during their work.

By the end of the course, the student should have acquired:

- Knowledge and understanding of the phenomenon of violence against women, with particular attention to prevention and punishment by the criminal justice system.
- Ability to apply the notions learned to the analysis of concrete cases and in the resolution of interpretative issues from a gender perspective
- Making judgements in interpreting the rules and identifying the most appropriate solutions.
- Communication skills in the presentation and discussion of legal issues, both in written and oral form, from a gender perspective.
- Autonomous learning skills, also through the consultation of regulatory, doctrinal and jurisprudential sources.

Contents

After some lessons regarding the phenomenon of gender violence, its cultural roots and widespread dimension, the focus will be on the different kinds of assault against women; it will be possible to evaluate the adequacy of these offenses in preventing and punishing gender violence's manifestations by facing the reality of their enforcement.

Detailed program

Gender stereotypes and root of the violence. Dimension and costs of the violence; psychological and physical consequences for the victims.

Supranational legislation on gender violence: in particular, the Istanbul Convention of 2011 and the Victims' Rights Directive of 2012, and their implementation in the Italian system.

Offenses against domestic violence and IPV violence, sexual abuse, femicide, exploitation of prostitution, WEB violence.

Prevention of the phenomenon beyond criminal law (in particular, sex offenders and beating men treatment programs).

Prerequisites

Having already passed the exam of Criminal law.

Teaching methods

The course, lasting 42 hours, will be mainly carried out with traditional lessons, enriched by the contribution of professional working with women victims of gender violence and/or with men acting violence (representatives of police, courts, psychologist, refugees, social workers etc.). For the remaining part (approximately the 20% of the course) lessons will be interactive, involving students in the discussion of the most controversial issues.

Assessment methods

Attending lessons is encouraged, because an active involvement in lessons and related activities may avoid the final oral exam, which is always available for all students, attending or not attending lessons.

Textbooks and Reading Materials

At the beginning of the course bibliographical references will be provided.
